Randy McCall was named the Director of Athletics at Cherry Creek High School in August of 1997, replacing Jack Meehan. McCall first came to Cherry Creek in 1990 as a social studies teacher and football coach after serving at Rangeview High School in the same capacity. He later worked as Dean of Students at Creek. During his tenure as Athletics Director, McCall has served on numerous CHSAA committees and is presently the czar of football and swimming for the Centennial League. Cherry Creek High School has enjoyed tremendous successes throughout these 12 years which include the following:

- 20% increase in student participation

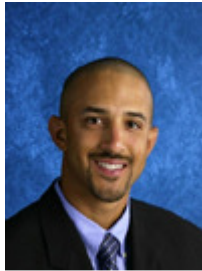
McCall brings a wealth of inter-scholastic athletic experience to the position. Prior to serving as A.D., McCall spent 14 years coaching football at the University of Northern Colorado, Idaho State University, Rangeview High School, and Cherry Creek, including the Creek State Championship football teams in 1990, 1991, 1994, 1995, and 1996. In addition, McCall refereed high school basketball beginning in 1980 and officiated 6 Colorado High School State Tournaments, including the 1991 4A Boys State Championship. Most recently, McCall has gone on to officiate the past 16 years at the NCAA level where he has officiated 9 consecutive NCAA tournaments including the National Championship game in 2004 and the Final Four in 2005.

The son of a high school athletic director, McCall prepped at Douglas County High School earning

All-Centennial League Honors in both football and baseball. He enjoyed a successful collegiate career in football at the University of Northern Colorado earning All-America honors as a player and academically.

In all, McCall has spent the past 33 years in inter-scholastic athletics as a player, coach, official and administrator.
